

What are the benefits of the Panhandle Pathway?

An off road bicycle and walking route linking Winamac, Star City, Thornhope, Royal Center, and Kenneth (west of Logansport), and other regional bicycle routes and trails.

A place for exercise and recreation.

A place for schools to supplement educational needs including physical fitness, team training, science, biology and other related fields of study.

An environment to display local agriculture, north central Indiana life style and country living.

A quiet place to enjoy nature, for walking and biking with family and friends.

Panhandle Pathway Trailheads

with limited parking

Winamac Trail Head (North end)

Pulaski County

In Pulaski County, from US 35 at the south edge of Winamac to Pulaski County Road 150 S. turn West. Trail head and parking are immediately on the south side of the county road 150 S

Star City Trail Head Pulaski County

Approx. 5 mi. south of Winamac

At Star City, from US 35 turn west onto Key St. Follow Key Street west to the corner of Key and Railroad St. Parking is on the west side of the trailhead off of Railroad St.

Royal Center Trail Head Cass County:

Approx. 13 mi. south of Winamac

From US 35N in Royal Center, turn west onto Kramer Street (across from Pioneer School Administration building) Trail head and parking are west of the corner of Kramer St. and Market St.

Kenneth Trail Head (south end) Cass

County Approx. 21 mi. south of Winamac

Take U.S. 24 West from Logansport past France Park to Cass County Road 600 West. Turn right and proceed north on 600 West to the first stop sign. This will be the intersection of 600 West and 50 North. Turn right and proceed east on 50 North approximately 1/2 mile. The trail head will be on your left (north side of 50 North).

Land acquisition from Rosser Drive, Winamac, IN. south to Kenneth was acquired March, 2009 and the first 4.8 miles between Winamac and Star City was completed by late fall. In April 2010 work began on the south 16 miles of the trail and is now open.

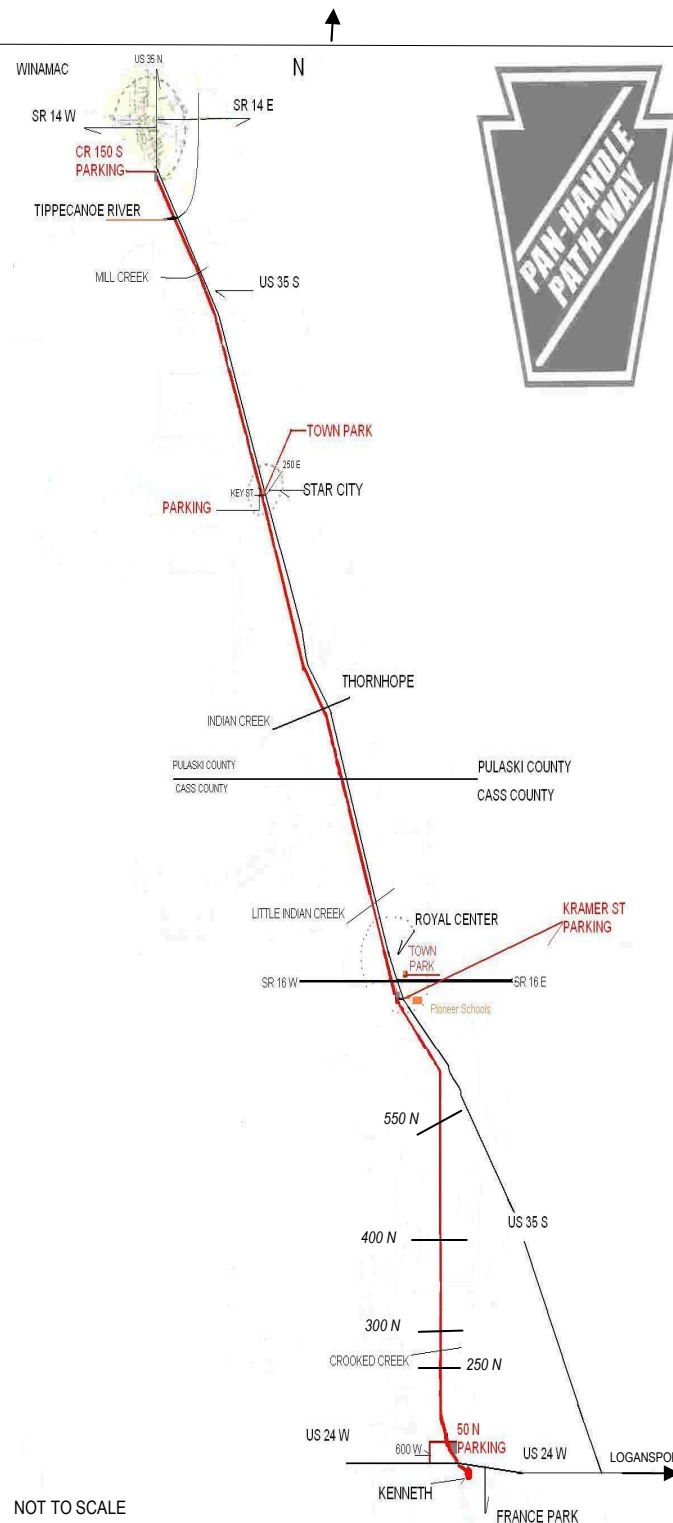
We are currently in need of resources to fund a perpetual maintenance program through the Pulaski County Community Foundation Endowment and will cap our \$4.8 million dollar campaign.
